On the Way to Las Vegas

This section includes points of interest and side trips along the way to the resort. For the most direct route, see "Driving Directions" below.

From Los Angeles, CA

Drive east on I-10, then north on I-15...

As you drive east from L.A., you'll travel between the Angeles and San Bernardino national forests over Cajon Pass (elevation 4,257 feet), and on through the eastern Mojave Desert.

The bit of water flowing along the eastern side of I-15 near Mojave Narrows Regional Park is one of the few places where the Mojave River runs above ground. For the most part, the 150-mile-long river flows from the San Bernardino Mountains underneath the desert floor.

Just eight miles farther, you come to a Mars-like landscape—the Rainbow Basin National Natural Landmark—where many sci-fi movies have been filmed. Huge colored slabs of stone tilt at crazy angles. Hike the many washes and you are likely to find fossils of creatures that roamed the basin millions of years ago.

Calico Ghost Town was once a rich mining town. A huge deposit of silver was found here around 1881. In 1886, after more than \$85 million in silver and gold was extracted from the multicolored "calico" hills, the price

of silver fell and the town went into decline. Today, the 1880s come back to life as you stroll the wooden sidewalks of Main Street, browse through western shops and ride the Calico-Odessa Railroad.

Nearly 12,000 prehistoric tools have been excavated from the Calico Early Man Archaeological Site. Dr. Louis Leakey, a noted archeologist, was the Calico project director from 1963 to his death in 1972. His old camp is now a museum and visitors center.

Due to its colorful, steep walls, Afton Canyon is often called the Grand Canyon of the Mojave. The canyon was carved over thousands of years by the rushing waters of the Mojave River.

Continue north on I-15 to Las Vegas...

Las Vegas is known for its glittering lights and non-stop entertainment. Fremont Street offers light shows, festivities and incredible shopping.

Don't miss the Liberace Museum, an entire building devoted to this flamboyant performer. On The Strip, The Imperial Palace Hotel is home to a rotating collection of 750 classic cars.

You'll be surprised by some of the exhibits at other casinos. The dolphin habitat at the Mirage was created to help educate the public about marine animals. Sigfried and Roy's Secret Garden, essentially a mini-zoo,

houses the **royal white tiger habitat**. The **Luxor**, contains a full-scale reproduction of **King Tut's tomb** and treasury of artifact replicas.

Just 20 minutes west of Las Vegas is Red Rock Canyon. The best way to see the area is a 13-mile, self-guided scenic drive that begins at the visitor center.

Hoover Dam and Lake Mead are also nearby, with six marinas allowing visitors to enjoy the lake to its fullest. The 727-foot concrete marvel is southern Nevada's most popular attraction. The tour of the dam is fascinating, and a Lake Mead cruise is a wonderful way to escape the heat.

The Valley of Fire State Park, approximately 60 miles northeast of Las Vegas, gets its name from the beautiful sandstone formations of the Mojave Desert. Wind and rain have sculpted the fiery red sandstone into spectacular domes, spirals, beehives and other unusual shapes.

Temperatures at Mt. Charleston and the Las Vegas Ski and Snowboard Resort (yes, Las Vegas has skiing!) are always cooler than in Las Vegas. These mountains, 35 miles northwest of Las Vegas, encircle the Toiyabe National Forest. A day trip to this area makes for a beautiful drive. Summer activities here include hiking, camping and bird watching.

Driving Directions

From the Las Vegas Airport

- From the main terminal, take Swenson St North.
- Take a right onto Tropicana Ave, then a left onto Spencer St.
- Proceed approximately one mile. The resort is on the left.

From Los Angeles, CA

- Take I-10 East to I-15 North.
- Continue on I-15 into Las Vegas, then take the Flamingo Rd exit east.
- Take a right onto Flamingo.

- Travel three miles east, crossing over Maryland Pkwy, then turn right onto Spencer St.
- Proceed 1/2 block. The resort is on the right.

From Sacramento, CA

- •Take Hwy 99 South to Bakersfield, then Hwy 58 East to I-15 North.
- •Follow **bold** directions to the left.
