General Information

Redistricting

Every ten years, Washington state must determine the state's congressional and legislative district boundaries, based on the results of the most recent U.S. Census. In early 2002 the independent, bipartisan Redistricting Commission completed its task of redrawing each of the state's districts based on the 2000 Census. The new district boundaries are in effect beginning with the 2002 fall elections and will be in effect until the 2012 fall elections.

The new census information indicates the state's official 2000 population is nearly 5.9 million people—an increase of about one million residents in ten years. Each congressional district now has about 655,000 residents; each state legislative district now has about 120,000 residents.

This guide, produced by Washington State Hospital Association (WSHA), pinpoints the location of all Washington's hospitals by congressional and legislative district after the 2002 redistricting process. Changes to congressional and legislative boundaries mean quite a few hospitals in Washington State now are located in different districts.

Washington's hospitals often serve people from more than one congressional or legislative district, depending on the size of the district and the proximity to other health-care facilities. A large number of constituents living in one legislative district may use a hospital located in another district. Legislators should realize they may represent hospitals physically located outside their legislative district. It is also important for hospitals to recognize their patients, and therefore their hospital, may be represented by legislators from outside their immediate community.

Washington State's Congressional Delegation

As in every state, two U.S. Senators represent the entire State of Washington for a six year term. About one-third of the U.S. Senate seats are up for election in each election year. The number of seats for each state in the U.S. House of Representatives is determined by the population of the state. Washington is represented by nine members of the House of Representatives, each of whom represents a particular section of the state. House seats are up for election every two years. U.S. House districts are much larger than state legislative districts.

Washington State Legislature

The Washington State Legislature is a two-house (bicameral) body with 49 members in the Senate and 98 members in the House of Representatives. Washington has 49 state legislative districts; each district is represented by two members of the House (called Representatives) and one member of the Senate (called Senators). Members of the Senate are elected to four-year terms, while House members are elected to two-year terms. Elections for Senators rotate so about half of all positions are up for election every two years; each House position is up for election every two years.





Federal Congressional District - Washington State




Federal Congressional Districts - Puget Sound Area






