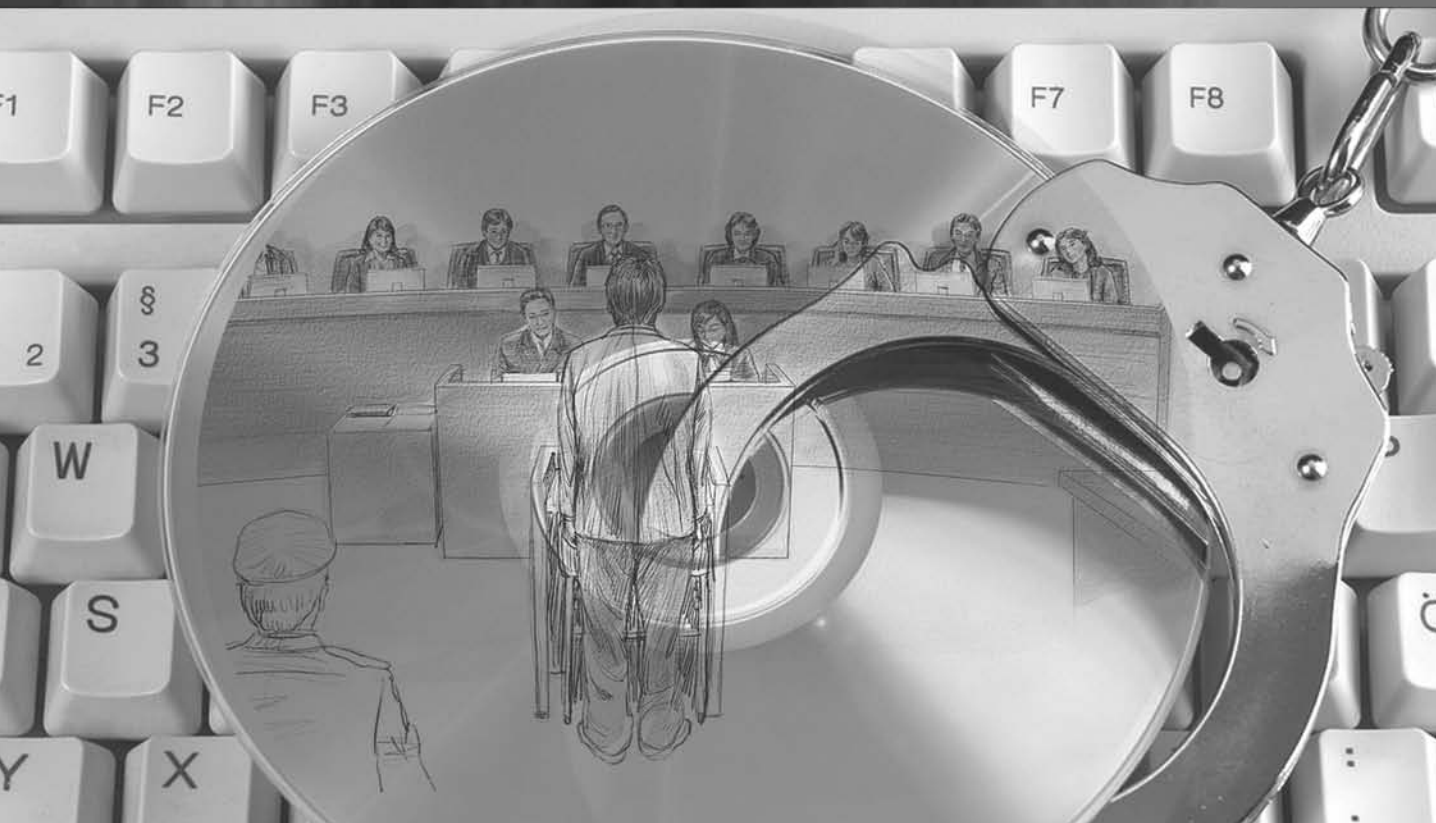

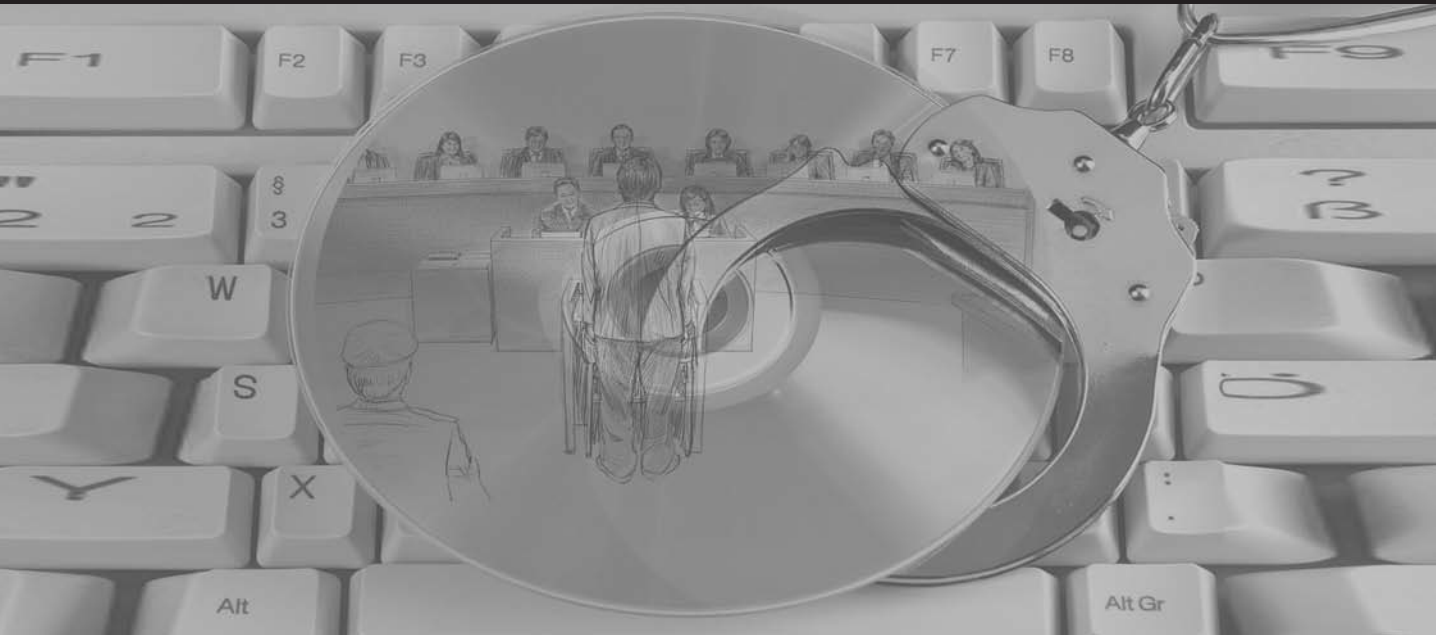

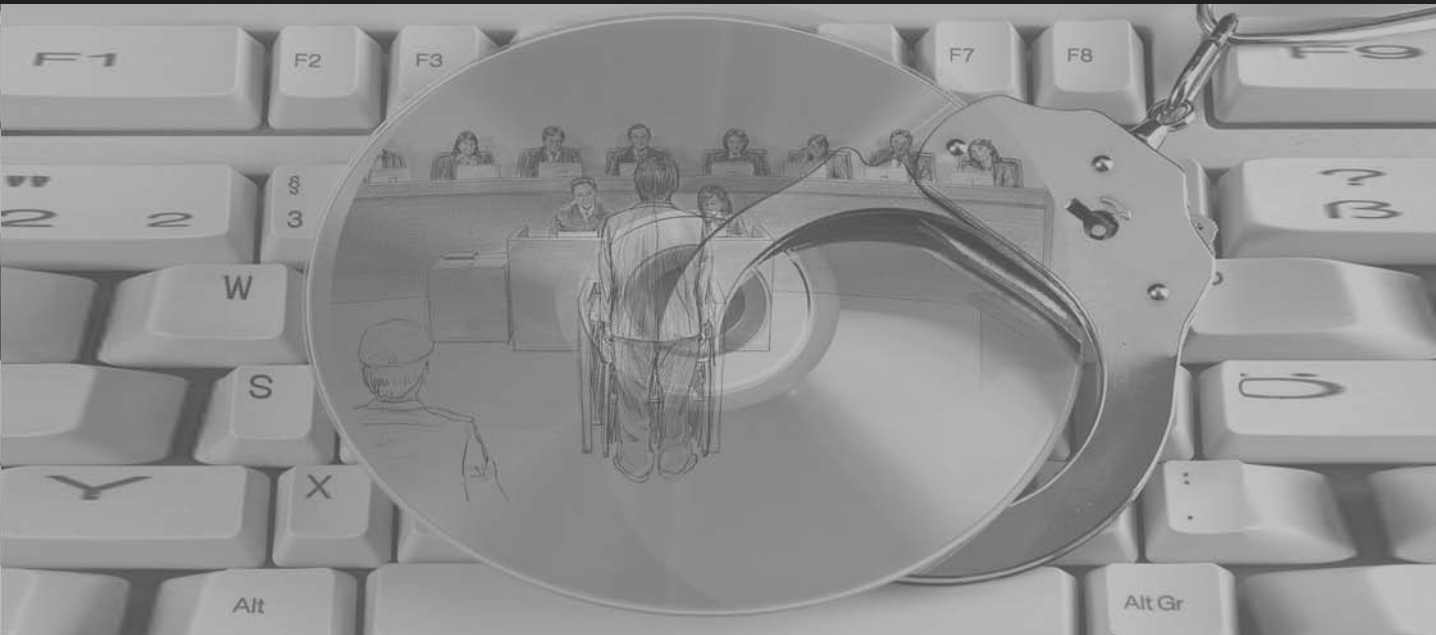

The text uses integrated multimedia resources, lively illustrations, and a crisp writing style to deftly guide readers through the intricate workings of the police, courts, and correctional systems; the concepts and processes of justice; and key policy issues. Equipping students for success in the classroom and well beyond, the new edition offers an even stronger emphasis on careers,

expanded treatment of the field's cornerstone cases, and up-to-the-minute coverage of contemporary challenges such as transnational crime, cyber crime, white-collar crime, and crimes related to the recent economic crisis.

### NEW TO THIS EDITION

- **NEW!** "Special Issues" Chapter 17. We have added a new chapter highlighting hot topics in contemporary criminal justice: transnational crime, cyber crime, white-collar crime, political crime, mortgage fraud, crimes/issues related to our economic collapse, etc. When we discussed these topics in the previous edition's Ch. 5, the concepts had a law enforcement emphasis. For this edition, we are putting these topics into Part 5 as "contemporary issues" and expanding the discussion to include ramifications related to courts/ sentencing and corrections as much as the challenges to the law enforcement community.
- **NEW!** Professional Spotlight Part Openers strengthen the text's emphasis on career opportunities in the field. In addition to "Careers in Criminal Justice" boxes, new "guest speaker" part openers feature professionals offering some insight or experience that puts their criminal justice career in a positive light. For example, Part One opens with commentary from Daisy Mongeau, an investigator in a public defender's office, and Samantha J. O'Hara, a U.S. probation officer, regarding the rewards and satisfaction they get from their careers in criminal justice.
- **NEW!** Reflecting the latest developments in case law, "Key

Cases" tables highlight important cases in policing, courts, corrections, juvenile justice, and homeland security. For example, Chapter 8 includes a new "Significant Cases in Policing" table showing leading Supreme Court cases involving police procedural law, organized by issue and summarizing the decision in the case. Chapter 15 includes a new "Significant Constitutional Cases on Correctional Matters" table.

- **NEW!** "Evolution of Case" inserts highlight a particular case and show how the law has evolved over time with related decisions and cases. For example, Chapter 8 includes new inserts featuring the evolution of *Carroll v. United States* regarding automobile searches, along with the evolution of *Miranda v. Arizona* regarding interrogations. Chapter 11 illustrates the evolution of *Gideon v. Wainwright* regarding when the right to counsel applies, as well as the evolution of *Batson v. Kentucky* on the issue of race discrimination in the use of peremptory challenges.
